What is this project?

- The TEC, together with NZQA and MoE, is working on improving cyber security maturity across the education sector in Aotearoa New Zealand.
- TEC is leading the process for the tertiary sector.
- As first steps the project aims to raise awareness of cyber security issues, assess the sector's current state and provide guidance and support.

Why this project?

- Cyber security attacks are on the rise and should be a major concern for all organisations and individuals.
- Everyone in the sector has a responsibility to help keep the sector safe.
- In many cases cyber-attacks could have been avoided relatively simply even as attacks become more frequent and more sophisticated.



Cyber security stats

- Many cyber-attacks are successful simply because basic security hygiene has not been followed. Last year:

80%

of security incidents can be traced to a few missing elements that could be addressed through modern security approaches.

900

password attacks per second defended against by Microsoft.

90%+

of accounts compromised were not protected with strong authentication.

- We can act now to create a safer cyber ecosystem

531,000

unique phishing URLs and 5,400 phish kits were taken down at the direction of our Digital Crimes Unit.

70 billion

email and identity threat attacks were blocked by Microsoft last year alone.

2.75 million

site registrations were successfully blocked by Microsoft to get ahead of criminal actors that planned to use them to engage in global cybercrime.



How will we go about this?

- Work with our partners to raise awareness.
- Assess the sector to gauge cyber security maturity levels and provide guidance and advice to help get a minimum level of protection in place.
- Investigate solutions that would raise cyber security maturity and could be offered sector wide
- Tactical approach (what can we do now); making use of opportunities in the cyber security and education sectors here and in Australia.
- Focus on people, process & technology (cyber security is not an 'IT problem')
